

Did you know; 1031 new houses ARE going to be built in Alton by 2028 and that this figure is fixed?

What's more, a further 700 minimum – potentially up to 1060 – are in the process of being applied for by landowners and developers **RIGHT NOW**, and for these developments there is still a chance for you to have your say.

The North Alton target sites alone account for 600-700 new homes. This will equate to 1000 plus more cars. Most of these people will not find work in Alton, and these commuters will be using Anstey Lane and Anstey Road. The resultant huge increase in traffic movements is clear.

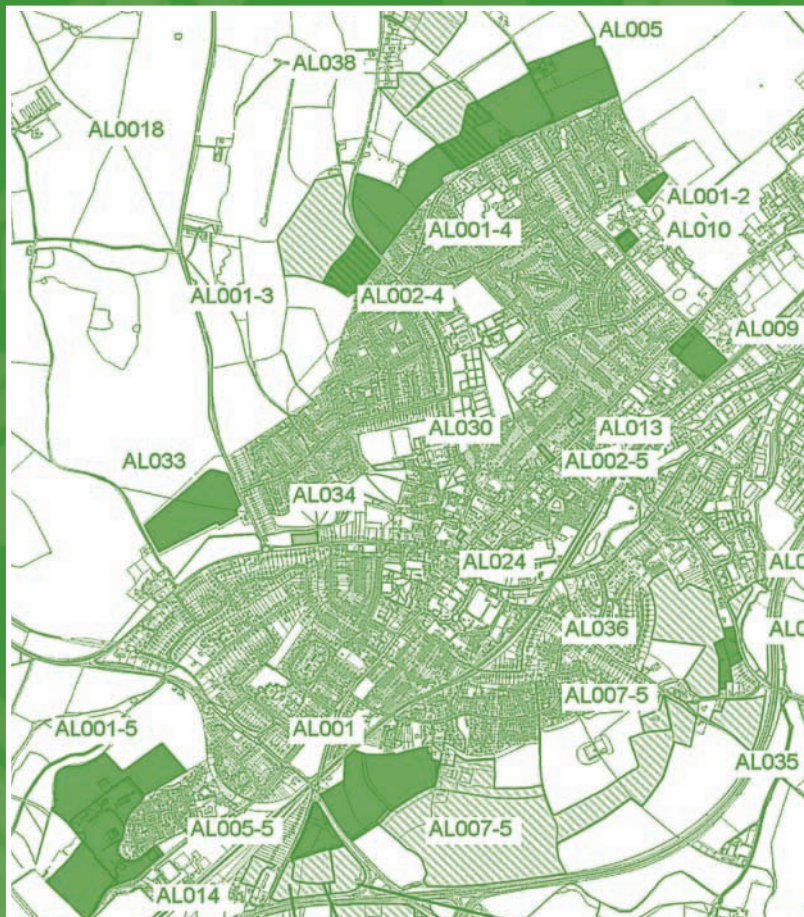
